The Importance of Non-Motorized Users

This training opportunity will provide participants with skills necessary to assemble a Road Safety Assessment (RSA) team, conduct an RSA and prioritize and mitigate any safety issues the RSA may uncover. The importance of integrating consideration for bicyclists and pedestrians, in the RSA process, will be the focus of the class.

Participants will receive 6 credit hours toward their CT Safety Champion designation.
