Roundtable Discussion Description:

Public Works professionals serve a critical role in emergency response such as providing safe access routes through debris management, handling traffic control, fuel management for municipal fleets, initial damage assessment for FEMA reimbursement purposes and restoration of the local infrastructure.

The goal of this roundtable discussion is to bring together towns and cities in Connecticut to discuss what is happening in each of the RESF#3 regions (Regional Emergency Support Functions) relating to public works response to emergencies.

Each participant will submit a question or area of concern to be discussed and will be expected to participate in the discussion. Bringing your experience and knowledge will enable you to learn from other participants as well as from technical experts.

Roundtable Facilitator:

Our facilitator, *Tim Webb*, Director of Public Works for the Town of Coventry, Connecticut has been actively involved in the RESF#3 Committee for Region 4 including participation in the development of the Regional Emergency Support Plan.
